








ANTALYA AREA

THE TURKISH RIVIERA

The Antalya region is one of Turkey's most glamorous spots for a dreamy getaway. Think yacht-filled marinas, designer boutiques and world-class golf courses. And of course there are plenty of hip beach clubs to see and be seen in. It's every bit the exclusive haven for holidaying.

PRISTINE BEACHES

Antalya boasts a whopping 650km swathe of white sandy beaches and tucked-away coves. PHONING HOME

To make a call back to the UK, simply dial **0044** before dialling the full number, without the first zero. For example, if you're calling 0800 123456, you would dial **0044 800 123456**. There are a number of ways to call home, though the following three are the most popular:

From your hotel room or apartment: This is by far the most convenient option, though it's usually the most expensive option, and you'll have to settle your bill before you return home.

Public phone boxes: While this is a much cheaper option, you'll need a handy supply of coins at the ready! Certain destinations have "crediphone" boxes, where you can buy prepaid cards from post offices, newsagents and other shops.

From a post office: Most post offices also have payphones available to customers.

CALLING FROM YOUR MOBILE PHONE

Each UK mobile phone network has different rules for roaming charges in the UK. Please check with your network provider, as you may be charged extra fees to use your UK allowance of texts, minutes or data when in the EU. There may also be a cap on data, either by day or by trip.

Your network provider usually sends a text when you arrive abroad to confirm the rates and exceptions, especially as a number of countries are not included in the latest EU Roaming Rules law. Exceptions include **Andorra**, **Bosnia and Herzegovina**, **Monaco**, **Montenegro**, **San Marino**, **Serbia**, **Switzerland**, **Turkey** and the **Vatican City**.

LOST OR STOLEN CREDIT CARDS

If your credit cards go missing for one reason or another, use one of the below numbers to speak to your bank directly. **Remember that these lines may cost you money to call**, but they operate 24 hours a day.

USEFUL INFO AND TIPS FOR TURKEY

Here's some information about Turkey that we thought you'd find handy, as you get to grips with the area and what it has to offer. If you want to find out the specifics of local transport, where the nearest Post Office is, or even just get a bar or restaurant recommendation, don't hesitate to ask one of our friendly Customer Helpers and they'll give you any assistance you might need!

BANKS

- Local banks include YapiKredi, Finansbank, Denizbank and GarantiBank.
- ATMs are clearly marked in resorts; always try and use the ones attached to a bank. Remember that your card will come out first before you can collect your money.
- Remember that the rate is usually better if you take your cash out as euros and not in pound sterling, as you will be charged more for the conversion from British money if you take the latter option.
- Banks are open from 9:00am to 5:00pm, Monday to Friday.

CHEMISTS

- Chemists are known as Eczane (pronounced as 'egg-sar-knee') and usually have a green cross and a snake on the sign.
- Their usual opening times are from 9:00am to 5:00pm, Monday to Friday, and there's a rota system for out- of-hours chemists, which is usually advertised in chemist windows.

POST OFFICES

- The post office in Turkey is known as the PTT and is usually identified with a sign that has black letters on a yellow background.
- Post offices are usually open from 9:00am to 5:00pm, Monday to Friday, and close at lunchtime.
- Services at post offices in Turkey include money exchange, postage and moneygrams.



TRANSPORT

BUSES

- · The local buses in resort are known as Dolmus, which means stuffed or squashed.
- These usually cost around 3YTL and bus stops are found throughout resorts.
- · Buses like these seat 15 people, but more may be standing!
- To go further afield, there are main bus stations that operate 50 seated coaches. Prices can vary and this can be booked on the internet or at the bus station.

TAXIS

- · Local taxis are yellow cabs and work on a meter system. The tariff changes from day to night.
- Taxis can be called by hotel receptions and there are a number of local taxi stations around the resort. It is customary to tip 10%.

CAR HIRE

• If you are looking to hire a car, please speak to one of our friendly Customer Helpers, who will be able to help you organise your transport. When booking your car, please make sure you fully understand the terms and conditions, and that you pay the correct insurance.

TRAINS

• There are no trains operating in the tourist areas or along the Aegean and Mediterranean coastline.
